I would ask members to remember, when using any of the tools which are attached to dust collection system, to open the vents to start with and close them after use. The system can keep a vacuum with up to 60% of the vents open. The problem with the equipment, such as the bandsaws, the dust accumulates in the lower compartment and eventually affects the free running of the blade.

With the year drawing to a close and a break from the 9th of December to early January, it will give me a chance to work with the Committee to plan a few ideas for the new year.

One of our biggest expenses is repairs and maintenance so we need to reduce that by more careful use of the machinery.

I plan to implement regular training by asking one of our Supervisors to give a ten minute talk on a particular tool at the end of our monthly members' meeting. From 1 February, we will be opening on Mondays. We have not put a quota on the days which members can come and we will resist that until the time that safety is likely to be compromised.
