The 2017 Annual General Meeting

The AGM was held on 18 August, during the monthly members' meeting. It was attended by 41 members who were informed

All members expressed their appreciation for the dedicated work of Ian Raper as President for the last three years and welcomed David Harrison as the new President.

Plan to Open the Shed Five Days A Week

Due to the continuing strong growth in membership, the Committee is considering opening another day each week. A poll of all members resulted in the following votes: Monday 36, Wednesday 23 and Sunday 18. Accordingly, the Committee will organise Supervisors and changes to documentation to communicate that, from 1 February 2018, workshops will be held on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday (Woodturners), Friday and Saturday.

Changes to the Attendance Register

All members and visitors are required to enter their names in the register when they attend a workshop. Please make sure that your writing is legible. We will soon have a more formal bound register to keep as a permanent record. As a precaution, in the event of fire, a new column has been added to insert time-out when you leave the Shed.

Fee Changes From January 2018

The Committee has noted that many new members pay the six month subscription of

\$50, possibly to do a single project and do not subsequently renew. It was considered that the Shed's investment in the induction and training process for such members was not an efficient use of resources so, from 1 January 2018, new members will pay \$100 for their first year of membership.

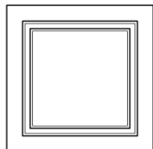
