A Queensland Visit

On a recent trip to the Sunshine Coast I saw a notice in the local paper, very aptly named, The Cooroy Rag, about the market and timber show. So without further ado off I went. The drive is about forty minutes from Noosa into the hinterland, a most pleasant drive through tropical green undulating farmland.

It is a big event for Cooroy, as there are stalls of handicrafts, local fruit and

vegetables, bands, theatre in the park, then there is a most amazing orchid exhibition.

The show was held in the grounds of a now disused timber mill, so it was a rather large area.

The local Men's Shed have taken over the ownership of the sight which is fabulous. There is a separate section where only Camphor Laurel wood is used to make toys, bowls, cutting boards of every size and shape.

These instruments are made from "hemp" by a local artisan.

The old timber drying ovens are use as wood turners work shop, where there are several lathes in each space.

They have a Lewis Mill, which is used in conjunction with the local council. Camphor Laurel trees are felled as they are considered obnoxious trees. The trunks are sawn into slabs which are inexpensive and fantastic grain as is the character of Camphor Laurel, not to mention the delightful aroma.



This engraving is about 5ft tall. The seasoning spaces all have a huge fan at the rear that push air through the stacked timber.
